The study of cyberbullying has exploded since its first appearance in a peer-reviewed journal article in 2005. Cyberbullying: From theory to intervention aims to

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make clear and practical sense of this proliferation of coverage by defining the problem of cyberbullying and examining its unique features. The volume provides a thorough overview of state-of-the-art research into the phenomenon, and discusses the development and evaluation of interventions to prevent and combat it. Whereas most research papers offer limited space to describe actual intervention methods, this book provides tremendous insight into the different theoretical methods and practical strategies available to combat cyberbullying. ## **Bullying and Teasing**

Bullying has long been tolerated as a rite of passage among children and adolescents. There is an implication that individuals who are bullied must have "asked for" this type of treatment, or deserved it. Sometimes, even the child who is bullied begins to internalize this idea. For many years, there has been a general acceptance and collective shrug when it comes to a child or adolescent with greater social capital or power pushing around a child perceived as subordinate. But bullying is not developmentally appropriate; it should not be considered a normal part of the typical social grouping that occurs throughout a child's life. Although bullying behavior endures through generations, the milieu is changing. Historically, bullying has occurred at school, the physical setting in which most of childhood is centered and the primary source for peer group formation. In recent years, however, the physical setting is not the only place bullying is occurring. Technology allows for an entirely new type of digital electronic aggression, cyberbullying, which takes place through chat rooms, instant messaging, social media, and other forms of digital electronic communication. Composition of peer groups, shifting demographics, changing societal norms, and modern technology are contextual factors that must be considered to understand and effectively react to bullying in the United States. Youth are embedded in multiple contexts and each of these contexts interacts with individual characteristics of youth in ways that either exacerbate or attenuate the association

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between these individual characteristics and bullying perpetration or victimization. Recognizing that bullying behavior is a major public health problem that demands the concerted and coordinated time and attention of parents, educators and school administrators, health care providers, policy makers, families, and others concerned with the care of children, this report evaluates the state of the science on biological and psychosocial consequences of peer victimization and the risk and protective factors that either increase or decrease peer victimization behavior and consequences.

### **Bullying Prevention and Intervention**

By focusing on violence committed by and upon youth (adolescents and young adults), the authors emphasize the importance of preventive, as opposed to merely retributive, approaches to the problem.

Specifically, of a nationally representative sample of adolescents, 13% reported being a bully, 11% reported being a victim of bullying, and 6% reported being both a bully and a victim (Nansel et al., 2001).

## **School Bullying**

### **Perfect Targets**

This report describes an initiative to reduce bullying in four schools - two secondary and two primary - in Liverpool and London. All had a high level of violent and anti-social behaviour both in the schools and the surrounding areas. Bengali and black students appeared to be disproportionately victimised and students usually lacked the confidence to report bullying incidents. The researchers worked with the staff and students to produce an anti-bullying code of

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practice and implementation strategy with support at all levels. Other measures included: improved supervision/surveillance of play areas; confidential contact for victims and others concerning bullying; meetings about bullying between staff and parents; class rules against bullying; roleplaying and using literature which highlights the plight of scapegoated groups and individuals; formal confrontations of bullies; use of 'neutral' students to help; and discussion groups for parents of students who bully or are bullied. In two years the level of bullying had decreased in three of the schools and remained about the same in the London secondary school.

### **Bullying and Emotional Abuse in the Workplace**

School bullying is widely recognized as an international problem, but publications have focussed on the Western tradition of research. A long tradition of research in Japan and South Korea, and more recently in mainland China and Hong Kong, has had much less exposure. There are important and interesting differences in the nature of school bullying in Eastern and Western countries, as the first two parts of this book demonstrate. The third part examines possible reasons for these differences - methodological issues, school systems, societal values and linguistic issues. The final part looks at the implications for interventions to reduce school bullying and what we can learn from experiences in other countries. This is the first volume to bring

together these perspectives on school bullying from a range of Eastern as well as Western countries.

## **School Bullying in Different Cultures**

Five years have elapsed since bullying started to be seriously addressed in Scottish schools. In that time, central government has funded materials and the appointment of a national anti-bullying development officer to assist local authorities and schools in developing effective strategies. Within a national framework, local authority initiatives and schools have adopted diverse approaches. This report documents the progress made across the country, bringing together local and national initiatives. The information contained in the report has been drawn from a number of sources: questionnaires sent in September 1994 to education authorities, and to teacher training institutions; documents prepared by education authorities; schools and individuals; and data collected by the Scottish Council for Research in Education (SCRE) during the course of its anti-bullying development work, and by the Anti-Bullying Development Officer. The focus is on policy, training, and support from within the educational system. Central government, local government, school and

This report will enable those striving to create an anti-bullying culture in schools to draw on experience of others. It sets out to inform the debate as to how to embed anti-bullying strategies securely into the fabric of the educational system. Chapters are: Sharing the Past--and the Future?; Summary; Understanding the Anti-Bullying Process; The Role of the SOED (Scottish Office Education Department); Nationwide Themes and Strategies; A Tour of Local Authority Action; Input from the Teacher Education Institutions; Anti-Bullying and the Independent Sector; and Future Action. Appendixes describing anti-bullying programs, resources, and actions account for about one-fifth of the document. Contains 62 references. (JB)
