Courtoy's Complaint

Last Chance High School is the incredible story of a caring and innovative principal and his staff who found ways to dramatically change the lives of behaviorally challenged teens. It describes the first two years of the successful transformation of an inner city special education school in New York City. From birth, many students in this school had been denied opportunities and had been given nothing to look forward to. General education schools could not find ways to cope with them. For most of these throwaway teens, Last Chance High was their only chance. At the end of two years, fights were drastically reduced, and vastly improved social skills were exhibited. It was the first time that students were given opportunities to return to general education schools and to earn high school diplomas. Many went on to enjoy happy,

productive lives. The philosophy that drove this successful transformation emphasized that all humans, including troubled teens, have the same basic and genetic needs to succeed, to have options and choices, to belong and be loved, and to have fun and not be bored. When these needs are met, the philosophy explains, there is no need to misbehave. Furthermore, schools have the the capacity and responsibility to create social and academic cultures where these fundamental needs can be met. Schools have the power to make a difference in their students' lives and help them overcome histories of failure. The following fundamental principles were the driving force behind the successful transformation: 1. The use of punishments is not effective as a tool to change someone's behavior. The reality is that punishment and coercion cause youngsters to resist and even shut down. 2. Internal motivation is the secret to long range change. Teachers should not perceive their roles as change agents but, rather, as facilitators that help those who want to change. 3. Kids are not widgets on an assembly line waiting to pass tests. They are complex individuals with unique personalities, strengths and needs who desperately need to be surrounded by caring adults. The book shares success stories that translate this philosophy to practice. For example, how did a publishing center motivate students to improve their writing skills? How did students pass exit exams when their absence rate was so high? How did the dreaded pop quizzes become a welcome instructional approach? How did students meet the dissection requirement in biology without using scalpels? Last Chance High School is not a textbook, although thought-provoking concepts are presented throughout. Even the high numbers of casualties suffered did not dissuade the Vikings from their lives as warriors.

It seems the foreign rulers came to assimilate Mayan culture, thus ensuring Tikal would continue to be a power base, and as a result, the city would not be abandoned until about the 10th century AD. As one of the Ancient Maya's most important sites, construction at Tikal was impressive, and even though it was apparently conquered, the city's

records were unusually well preserved. This includes a list of the city's dynastic rulers, as well as the tombs and monuments dedicated to them. Thanks to this preservation, Tikal offers researchers their best look at the Ancient Maya and has gone a long way toward helping scholars understand Mayan history. Tikal: The History of the Ancient Maya's Famous Capital covers the history of the city, as well as the speculation and debate surrounding it. The Book Thief

The true story of innocence, conspiracy and betrayal described in this book took place in early 19th century London. Maureen Sayers - on whose journals the book is based - was born in Ireland and moved to London in 1817. This was after the death of her mother the previous year. By all accounts an intelligent and attractive young lady, Maureen was strong-willed but nevertheless retained a delightful innocence, one that would immediately place her at the mercy of the capital's sordid underbelly. After eventually escaping the clutches of her lecherous tormentors, she found work with Hannah Courtoy, caring for Hannah's husband John. During his lifetime John Courtoy became one of the richest men in England. Remarkably he amassed his fortune while working as a humble wig-maker. He achieved his wealth through many activities in addition to those of his chosen occupation. Initially he developed an employment registry, possibly the first of its kind in England. Using the money derived from this activity, he then became a prodigious money-lender, catering largely to the needs of the

aristocracy, gentry, and merchants of London. As his fortune grew, he proved to be a wily investor. He was also a renowned miser. John Courtoy was born Nicolas Jacquinet in 1729, in the town of Jussey, France. He adopted the name of John Courtoy after he fled to England in 1751. When he eventually died in 1818 he was 89 years of age. John made two Wills, one in 1810, the other in 1814. The second Will was made when his mental health had allegedly become severely impaired, raising many questions as to its validity. Maureen raises several interesting observations concerning the destination of his fortune. Central to her interpretation of events is that his Last Will and Testament of 1814 was fraudulently compiled. According to Maureen's account his estate - which would be worth over £20 million in today's money - might have ended up in the wrong hands. Maureen's narrative provides sparkling insights into early 19th century London life. Whether she is recording visits to the theatre, attendance at glittering soirees or simply everyday life on the capital's putrefying streets, by immersing oneself in her story, it is possible to experience many of 19th London's fascinating qualities, both virtuous and corrupt.

Bible History for Children and Youth

The Regulation of the Legal Profession in Ireland is a new and insightful exploration of history, controversy and reform

relating to the Irish legal system. He added that Hosier's "innovative approach to the problem of lawyers' misconduct is, in particular, worth noting. This aspect of her work has the potential to help alleviate a problem which has been extremely costly for both the legal profession and wider society alike. Her doctoral research also provides a valuable insight into the impact of the Troika upon the regulation of the legal profession in so-called 'bailed-out countries.'" Professor Pech concluded that the author "should be congratulated for having made an exceptional contribution to the current debate on the regulation of the legal profession both nationally and internationally. I have no doubt that her original and thought-provoking work will be useful to policy-makers and scholars alike." This book features Professor John Flood's new, substantive introduction, explaining the worldwide implications of professional reform efforts, the financial crisis that precipitated them, and the relation to regulation of the legal profession in other countries. It also includes the author's notable examination of the effect of the Troika's bailout conditions on law reform possibilities in Ireland. This part of the book was presented in the US at the 2013 annual conference of the Law and Society Association. Finally, the book adds a section on 2014 developments in reform efforts in Ireland. (Answers are available in Teacher Resources and Answer Keys to Accompany Bible History for Children and Youth, which is sold separately and also comes with several reading comprehension game ideas and question cards about the Bible stories to cut apart for the games.) The stories also provide the correct pronunciation of certain Bible names used in the story. From your eBook, you can click on the red Bible name to hear the pronunciation audibly. Paperback readers can refer to the pronunciation guide. In addition, many of the stories

have illustrations that can be filled in with colored pencils or crayons, and several even include reproductions of famous paintings in the public domain, such as Carl Bloch's "Sermon on the Mount." Moreover, the stories provide a link to freebibleimages.org, where you will find a more thorough set of illustrations and slides to display on your computer screen or interactive whiteboard as the story is read. (For quick access to these images, it is recommended that a teacher have her eBook available, as you can go directly to the story's illustrations on their website by clicking on the link beneath the title.) What's more, 38 Bible verses taken from the New American Standard Bible are available for display at the end of the eBook, and a link to the same Bible verses is posted on page 8 for paperback readers. Each verse comes with its own tune to assist children with its memorization. Simply click on the arrow or the verse's reference as instructed to hear it played. Bible History for Children and Youth is a part of the Habakkuk Educational Materials reading program, designed to teach primary-grade students how to read. The Old and New Testament stories teach students the ways of God and how He operated in the lives of His people. In the Old Testament section, students will learn how God kept His promise to give the children of Israel the land of Canaan, as well as how He responded to the prayers of such persons as Hannah, David, and Hezekiah when they cried out to Him for help. In the New Testament section, they will read about Jesus' teachings, His love and compassion for all people, the sacrifice He made for us, and the mission His followers embarked on to spread the Good News. In addition, this book elaborates on Old Testament prophecies that were fulfilled, including the Babylonian captivity and the suffering Messiah. The history behind certain Jewish and Christian holidays are also examined in this book, such as Passover and Purim, as well as the significance behind the Lord's Supper.
